Today all three of our services will have a Harvest focus: a Harvest Communion at 8am, our Altogether Worship Harvest Festival at 10am, and our Tea Time Church Harvest service at 4pm. It's a special day in the life of the Church, as we give thanks for the food we eat, and for all God's good gifts to us. In a world where many are in need, it's important that we take this time to give thanks for all that we have and enjoy.

Our Harvest theme for this year is 'Contentment'. In our reading from St. Paul's letter to his young apprentice Timothy, Paul writes, 'Godliness with contentment is great gain' (1 Timothy 6:6). We live in a society where many of us have plenty. But do we have the inner peace and sense of security to enjoy the life we have? Worry is endemic in our society, and often we find ourselves caught up in an anxious and troubled mind-set. How can that change?

Well both Jesus himself, and St. Paul – the writer of our reading from the Epistles for this morning – have words of wisdom for us today. Jesus encourages us to lift our eyes about the immediate issues facing us, and to find the heavenly wisdom of seeking first the kingdom of God, and God's righteousness. St. Paul reveals the secret he has discovered of being content in any and every circumstance, whether he's experiencing plenty, or being in need. Do we know that sort of peace and security in our lives?

As we give thanks for the Harvest today, and all the Lord's goodness to us, my prayer is that we'll find the inner peace and contentment to enjoy every good gift that has been given to us.
