#### **Dear Friends**

I enjoy the BBC program, the repair shop. I love the craftsmanship, the skill and the care they take when fixing all manner of stuff. I also love the fact that while making it fit for purpose, they always seem to preserve the antiquity of the thing. It's still recognisably the same object, despite being renewed. They are in the restoration business.

Our old testament reading this week is from Isaiah 35, where God is in the restoration business. It speaks of water gushing into deserts and streams flowing in the wilderness, with plants blooming and blossom forming. It also speaks of people being restored, "then will the eyes of the blind be opened & the ears of the deaf unstopped." You'll probably recognise these verses from the Messiah. After many chapters prophesying exile & judgement, the Lord at last is bringing hope.

Reskilled is in the restoration business as well. For the long term unemployed, hope is in short supply. We run a wood workshop where people can come and make simple wooden items. But the real purpose to build confidence, to develop generic work skills, and explore opportunities — whether into paid employment or some kind of volunteering. It is still early days, and very hard work, but seeing previously hopeless people with a sense of purpose and growing confidence, makes it well worth the investment.
