Dear Friends

Today, on this second Sunday of Advent, we'll be lighting the second of our Advent candles. Traditionally this candle represents the prophets, who foretold the coming of the Messiah. Our Old Testament reading for today comes from the prophet Malachi, who writes, 'See I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come' (3:1). It's a prophecy that would be fulfilled through the life of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus to come.

But then, unexpectedly, Malachi writes, 'But who can endure the day of his coming?' (3:2). It's a theme that is taken up by John the Baptist, who preached 'a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins' (Luke 3:3).

These readings remind us the coming of the Lord as Emmanuel – God with us – is a moment of great joy; the fulfilment of prophecies that had been long foretold. But it's also a time for great soul-searching, as we consider the implications of such a 'coming'. This season of Advent, in partnership with the season of Lent, offers us a time to reflect on the meaning of the Lord's coming among us; and to prepare our hearts and minds in readiness for that time.

My prayer for each of us, this Advent, is that we will find time and space to hear that message from the prophets once again.
