## **Dear Friends**

Today, in our Sunday Services, we'll be focussing on the Baptism of Jesus. It took place right at the beginning of his ministry, and is recorded by all four Gospel writers. Many people were coming to the Jordan river to be baptised by John the Baptist; and Jesus also comes. As John baptises him the heavens open and the Holy Spirit descends on him like a dove; and he hears those extraordinary words, 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased' (Luke 3:22).

Jesus' baptism is the second event in this season of Epiphany. It began last Sunday with the Wise Men, or the Magi, following the star to Bethlehem, and finding Jesus there. That was the first 'Epiphany moment', or moment of revelation or realisation; Jesus is the Messiah for the whole world, not just for the Jews. Jesus' baptism is the second 'Epiphany moment'; here we discover Jesus as God's dearly beloved Son — and God as a deeply loving Father; here we also discover the Holy Spirit — the third person of the Trinity. It's a moment in time when we see God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit acting together — the Trinity revealed.

Through these five Sundays in Epiphany we'll be discovering more of the way the Lord revealed himself — in ways that are often deeply human. We'll consider how the Lord might reveal himself to us today, if we have eyes to see, ears to hear, and hearts that are open to his presence among us....


