Dear Friends

During the month of February, we return to 'Ordinary Time', in the Church's year. We've finished the season of Epiphany, and have a month to go before Lent begins on the 5th March. I always enjoy 'Ordinary Time', as it gives some time and space to think more deeply about subjects we don't always have room for during the festival seasons.

And today our readings focus on the theme of 'vocation'. First, we hear of Isaiah's call to be a prophet, with all the challenges that that would entail (Isaiah chapter 6). Next, we move on to Jesus' calling of the first disciples, by the sea of Galilee; and their vocation to become 'fishers of people' (Luke 5:1-11). And finally, we read about Paul's calling to become an apostle, in the most dramatic of ways. For all of these people God's call was life-changing, and irreversible; nothing would ever be the same again.

That theme of 'vocation' runs through the whole of the Scriptures. God is always calling, always reaching out to us, always inviting us into an ever-deepening relationship with himself. That's where it begins, but it never stops there. As Christians we often find ourselves doing and becoming things we may never have envisaged; and the opportunities and challenges rarely stop coming. What might the Lord be calling you to do for him today? What kind of person might he be encouraging you to become? Who might he want you to reach out to? Let's keep our hearts and minds open to all he has in store for us, and for our church....
