#### **Dear Friends**

I wonder what thoughts are generally at the fore-front of your mind? Maybe your thoughts are on small details of tasks needing doing, people to see, upcoming events. Perhaps your mind is remembering the last film you watched, book you read, or what has just come up in the news. Maybe your thoughts are more anxious, with worries about the family, or work, or the situation in Ukraine or Gaza. Maybe your mind wanders from one idea to another, without any particular rhyme or reason.

Our Gospel reading for today (Luke 4:1-13) demonstrates that Jesus' mind was filled with the Scriptures. At the end of forty days in the wilderness, Jesus is subjected to mental and psychological testing of a particularly vivid kind. And each time he responds, 'It is written' – i.e. 'It is written in the Scriptures'. His mind and spirit were immersed in the words and truths of the Hebrew Bible – the books of the Law, and the first five books of our Bible. When life was tough, his mind was full of God's promises, his wisdom and his truth; that was his great defence.

How full are our minds with the truth of the Gospel, conveyed to us through the Scriptures? And can those truths be our defence in troubling times? We'll be exploring this in our service today.

Wishing you every blessing as the season of Lent begins.
