You know that feeling you have when someone tells you that your soul will be pierced with a sword because of your child's future? No? Fair enough, I guess. I mean, that happens...never. What must Mary have felt, I wonder? How did she reconcile that strange speech with the joy and pride of holding her little bundle in her arms?

But you must remember how it felt when you hugged your new-born and tried to work out what waterproof container you could put them in to keep them hidden in the reedbed of a flowing river, in case anyone came to do them harm? No, not that either?

Those three incredible women, compassionate and resourceful, but not even given a name, form the basis of Moses' start in life.

Today we are unpacking the stories of two mothers and the female networks around them, whose love was the springboard for the stories of two of the most central figures in the Bible. And at the same time remembering the same scenes, played out over and over again in every generation, of women's capacity to love; women's resourcefulness, women's compassion and women's courage bringing each new generation into being, in acts of selflessness and love.
