Post Communion Prayer



Dear Friends

I've always loved optical illusions, where first you see one thing, and then moments later you see something else.



That's exactly what reading today's account from Acts felt like. First you see Paul, in prison, chained, denied freedom of any kind. Your heart goes out to him, especially when you hear of the earthquake, and the fear that must have brought. Even though it eventually brings him his freedom...

But by the end of the story, if you change perspective, if you look not with worldly glasses but with spiritual ones, it's the Prison Guard who is set free. What an amazing paradox - although oddly in keeping with the extraordinary tales of miracles and faith we hear Luke recount.

Kinda begs the question what else could look different in our lives if we change the perspective we are looking through? And what freedoms do we already have that we are hardly aware of? Some wonderful thoughts to play with in the week ahead.
