Dear Friends

On the very first Pentecost morning, the disciples were gathered together in Jerusalem. They'd been waiting together in prayer since Jesus' ascension, as he'd told them to do; waiting for the gift that the Father would give them. There's a real sense of anticipation in our reading from the Book of Acts for this morning (Acts 2:1-21); a sense that something extraordinary was about to happen. And it does. Luke tells us that 'Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues (or languages) as the Spirit enabled them' (Acts 2:2-4). Something noisy, visual and tangible was clearly happening; so much so that a great crowd of people gathered around, to see what was going on.

And so, Peter stepped in to explain what was happening. He gathers the crowd together, then takes them back to the Old Testament and some words from the prophet Joel. 'In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days' (Joel 2:28-32). What had been foretold by the prophets many years ago, was now happening in their very midst. And as Peter continues to preach, some 3000 people take the decision to join the disciples as followers of Jesus. The Church was born. And the whole of the book of Acts, the 28 chapters which follow, are the account of the working of Holy Spirit in the lives of Jesus' followers – bringing the world-wide Church into being.

Today we'll be finding out more about that first Pentecost event, and what it means for us - and for the Church - today.
