Dear Friends

Today's gospel reading tells the story of the Good Samaritan. It is a story so familiar to us that it is easy to fail to appreciate how shocking this parable was to the lawyer and to those who first heard it told.

One must understand that to all Jews at that time there was no such thing as a "good Samaritan". They were the enemy. That is the historical, social and cultural context of this parable, so Jesus referring to a good Samaritan was a shocking and provocative concept. They were the ultimate outsider.

At the conclusion of telling the story Jesus asks the lawyer: "Who was the neighbour to the badly beaten Jew on the road to Jericho?" So counter cultural was the thrust of the story that the lawyer was unable to admit that it was the Samaritan, he simply said "it was the one who showed mercy".

Jesus uses this shocking parable to teach us that mercy, kindness and neighbourly love must transcend our racial, ethnic, cultural, and social boundaries.

As someone said to me recently, the Good Samaritan was Jesus. We are called to become more like Jesus. So, with the help of Holy Spirit, may we become more and more like him showing mercy and neighbourly love.
