This week 40 years ago band from all over the world united just for one day to highlight the plight of thousands starving in Ethiopia and raised £1,000,000's. The Live Aid legacy lives on today. I'm looking forward to telling you about how it all happened today.

What has this got to do with Martha and Mary in the reading for this Sunday you may very well ask. Well, there are some similarities which I'll tell you about.

Allow me to summarise the story of sisters, Martha and Mary. Jesus was visiting their home and Martha was busy in the kitchen preparing the meal but Mary was seemingly doing nothing, sitting at Jesus' feet. Martha admonished Mary for not helping, but Jesus defended her by pointing out that Mary was prioritising her spiritual nourishment over Martha's worldly concerns.

It's all too easy to focus on our worldly needs and tasks we have to do and all too easy to put God to one side because we are all busy. This happens to me so often. I realise I've got up and got going with what I had to do in the day and it's not until midday I get to my Daily Office apps to listen to what God has to say about today. But God, being a forgiving and loving God still holds me and I am refreshed always by what his message to me is for that day.

When you don't have time for God is when you need to find time for God.
