God of our pilgrimage, you have willed that the gate of mercy should stand open for those who trust in you: look upon us with your favour that we who follow the path of your will may never wander from the way of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Dear Friends

Our bible readings for today have a clear focus on 'faith' – putting our trust in God, and living that out in our daily lives.

From the earliest days of the biblical story, faith has been central. In our reading from the book of Genesis for today (15:1-6), Abraham is commended for this faith. In fact, he believes that his descendants will be as many as the stars in heaven, even though he and his wife Sarah are old, and beyond the age of child-bearing. This faith in God is 'credited to him as righteousness' (15:6).

Our reading from the New Testament book of Hebrews gives a litany of those who have lived by faith, giving us examples to emulate in our own lives. It begins with Abel, then Enoch and Noah, then moves on to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Rahab, Gideon and many more of the Old Testament heroes. All of these people were commended for their faith, even though none of them received what had been promised to them in their lifetime. The writer of the book of Hebrews tells us that 'Faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see' (11:1).

And Jesus, in our Gospel reading for this morning, articulates the meaning of that hope (Luke 12:32-34). We hope for the kingdom of heaven – a life beyond this one, full of righteousness, peace and truth. That's the 'treasure' we need to set our hearts on; the treasure we need to believe in; the possession that we need to sell everything to attain. We do this through faith, following in the footsteps of Abraham and the saints of old. Let's consider today how each of us may grow in faith, and find that faith credited to us as righteousness.

Mission Focus for August: North Guildford Food Bank

The North Guildford Food Bank (NGFB) provides temporary help for individuals and families living in the Guildford area by supplying food parcels and signposting people to other helpful local services. Last year NGFB fed nearly 3500 adults and 2500 children – an increase of about 1500 adults and children on the previous year and nearly triple pre-pandemic levels. There will be a collection box in church in October for Harvest and also throughout November to contribute towards Christmas parcels.
