Dear Friends

Who wants to be a Pharisee?

"Pharisee" what thought does that conjure up for you? I'll bet "hypocrite" or "legalistic"? But I doubt "faithful" Yet why such a bad press? After all, Pharisees believed in the authority of scripture, in miracles, in angels, and the resurrection of the dead. And they asked some neat questions: "is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"-"What's the greatest command?" I expect its because



they didn't get along to well with Jesus - "you brood of vipers" He called some of them. So, we tend to go along with that.

Yet in reality, the Pharisees were a respected religious group. People looked up to them for spiritual guidance. And theologically, Jesus was almost always in agreement with them. Even the style of His encounters was typically that of first century rabbinical debate. No, His beef wasn't with the group as a whole. Just those who heaped legalistic burdens on the people, while not fulfilling the call to love their neighbour. There are even reliable Jewish texts, which show that the Pharisees themselves were critical of hypocrites in their ranks.

Thus today, when I hear that objection — "I don't go to church, because its full of hypocrites" I know what they really mean is: "your few bad apples (who get all the publicity) are my excuse for turning my back on God". Yet in reality, whether we're Anglican or Baptist, Methodist, or Pharisee, we are by and large "good apples", though still sinners. Seeking to be both hearers and doers of the Word. So, to those watching we ask for forgiveness for our "bad apples." Trusting that "faithful" will one day replace "hypocrite" as together we build God's kingdom on earth to His glory in Heaven.,

Mission Focus for August: North Guildford Food Bank

The North Guildford Food Bank (NGFB) provides temporary help for individuals and families living in the Guildford area by supplying food parcels and signposting people to other helpful local services. Last year NGFB fed nearly 3500 adults and 2500 children – an increase of about 1500 adults and children on the previous year and nearly triple pre-pandemic levels. There will be a collection box in church in October for Harvest and also throughout November to contribute towards Christmas parcels.
