Dear Friends

Our Gospel reading for today comes from Luke's Gospel, and chapter 14. Here we find Jesus at the home of a prominent Pharisee, where he had been invited for a meal. Others had been invited too, and Jesus was watching carefully how both the host and the guests were acting. There were clearly 'norms' which had to be adhered to, in which status and importance were key. Into this competitive, self-seeking environment Jesus has things to say to both the guests and also the host; and he does this in the form of two parables.

The first parable could be described as a 'Parable of Humility' (Luke 14:7-11), and the second a 'Parable of Hospitality' (Luke 14:12-14). The first warns ambitious guests who wanted to be noticed by the host, of the dangers of promoting themselves above other people; if someone more important arrives, and they've sat in the best seats, they're likely to be asked to move and thus humiliated. The second parable warns the self-important host against offering hospitality in order to be paid back by his guests at a later stage; that may be how the world works, but it's not how the kingdom of God operates.

Both these parables explore the theme of humility – both before people, and before God. We'll consider what that might mean for us, in our day to day lives.

Mission Focus for August: North Guildford Food Bank

The North Guildford Food Bank (NGFB) provides temporary help for individuals and families living in the Guildford area by supplying food parcels and signposting people to other helpful local services. Last year NGFB fed nearly 3500 adults and 2500 children – an increase of about 1500 adults and children on the previous year and nearly triple pre-pandemic levels. There will be a collection box in church in October for Harvest and also throughout November to contribute towards Christmas parcels.
