Dear Friends

Today is the second Sunday of Advent, in this season when we prepare for Christmas and Jesus' coming among us. We'll be lighting the second of our Advent candles, and remembering the prophets who prepared the way for Jesus to come. The prophet who is uppermost in our minds for today is John the Baptist.

John was a colourful character, and with a fiery message: 'Repent for the kingdom of heaven has come near!'. His vocation was to prepare the way for Jesus to come; and many people came out into the wilderness to hear John preach and to be baptised by him. They believed his words that the Messiah was coming, and they needed to be ready. John was baptising with water, but when Jesus came he would baptise people with the Holy Spirit and with fire (Matthew 3:11).

Today we too prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming among us once again, as we celebrate the miracle of his birth at Bethlehem. The Christingles which we'll be making during our 10am and 4pm services today help us to understand the meaning of Jesus' coming:

The orange reminds us of the world God created, and of which we are a part; God is our creator and we are his children. The red ribbon reminds us that not everything in our world is good, but that Jesus came to transform our world. The fruits remind us of the fruits of God's Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, self-control. And the candle in the middle reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World.

As we make our Christingles today, I pray that we'll understand that message more clearly, and be ready to share it with the world.

MME's friend in Baghdad is the Rev'd Canon Faiz Jirjees MBE, from St. George's Anglican church there. His message is that tensions between the communities and recent regional conflict have sent shockwaves through Iraq, heightening insecurity, increasing instability and deepening fear. So, as Christmas approaches and is celebrated, let us remember the people of Iraq, of whatever religion or sect, and pray that peace will prevail and that tensions there will die down.
