Dear Friends

Today, in the Church's calendar, we remember 'The Holy Innocents'. These were the young children in Bethlehem, under the age of two, who were condemned to death by King Herod, following Mary and Joseph's flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-23). When Herod realised he had been outwitted by the Magi, who had returned to their country be a different route, he orders the mass killing of children in the hope of putting to death the infant Jesus. It's a harrowing story, and not necessarily we one to face up to on this first Sunday after Christmas.

But the suffering of innocent children is not something we can escape from in our own times, and the loss of innocent lives in Gaza over the past few years brings that home to us. Where is God when it hurts? Why does God allow suffering? How do we make sense of it all? They're questions that confront us from time to time; and questions that - for some people – are more urgent during this season of Christmas.

Our reading from the Letter to the Hebrews for today, and chapter 2, addresses those questions in a radical way. It calls us to start by looking at Jesus, his birth, his life, his teaching, and his own suffering. If we can focus our thoughts here to begin with, rather than starting with the questions that suffering presents, we may find a pathway to a new understanding; and in that new understanding we may find comfort and hope in our own times of need. I pray that will be true for us as we study the Scriptures together today.

Mission Focus for December: Mosaic Middle East (MME)

Our prayers are again requested for the Middle East, and, with the Gaza conflict in the forefront of our thoughts, it is easy to forget that Iraq still faces a veritable storm of trouble. MME's friend in Baghdad is the Rev'd Canon Faiz Jirjees MBE, from St. George's Anglican church there. His message is that tensions between the communities and recent regional conflict have sent shockwaves through Iraq, heightening insecurity, increasing instability and deepening fear. So, as Christmas approaches and is celebrated, let us remember the people of Iraq, of whatever religion or sect, and pray that peace will prevail and that tensions there will die down.
