Dear Friends

In today's Gospel, Jesus leads Peter James & John onto a high mountain, where He is transfigured. His face shining like the sun, His clothes become dazzling white, and Moses and Elijah appear beside Him. It is a breath-taking moment—one the disciples will never forget. And like many of us when something amazing happens, Peter immediately gets energised to start planning a new project: "Lord, it is good that we are here. Let's build some shelters."

Peter's response is wonderfully human. He wants to stay where things are beautiful, clear, and comfortable. It is a natural human impulse. But Jesus does not let them stay on the mountain. Because Faith is not about camping out in spiritual highs; it is about being strengthened for the journey back into everyday life.

This extraordinary encounter happens away from the crowds, in silence and prayer. That too can be a challenge in our noisy turbulent world. Silence can feel uncomfortable—almost suspicious. Yet the Transfiguration shows us if we never step away, we may miss just what God is trying to show us.

Then a voice from the cloud says, "This is my beloved Son... listen to Him." Not "scroll past Him," not "fit Him in when we have time", but "listen to Him." It is a gentle Divine reminder just whose voice truly matters in our lives.

Lastly, when the disciples fall to the ground in fear, Jesus touches them and says, "Rise, and do not be afraid." No thunder no lighting. Just a moment of quiet, gentle encouragement and reassurance. And is it not the same for us too? While life is never without its challenges, whatever mountains we have to climb, whatever fears we may face, Jesus promises that the gentle, quiet, reassurance of His presence, is never, never, that far away.

Mission Focus for February: Guildford Town Centre Chaplaincy (GTCC)

GTCC is run by various Guildford churches for the people of Guildford. Over 100 volunteers are: Street Angels; Community Angels and Volunteer Chaplains. Since 2008 Street Angels have provided practical care every Friday and Saturday night to people in a vulnerable state in Guildford Town Centre because of eg alcohol, drugs, or homelessness. In 2008, almost overnight, tensions were calmed, crime dropped, and antisocial behaviour was reduced by around a third. More information in February's magazine and on their website gtcc.org.uk/.
