THOUGHTS FROM THE VICARAGE



As we look ahead to the month of November, I'm very conscious of the events taking place in the Middle East. As I write this article (14th October) the events of yesterday are fixed in my mind: the scenes of celebration as Israel's last surviving hostages returned home from Gaza after two years; the hundreds of Palestinian prisoners and detainees being released, as part of the first phase of the Peace Plan; the emotional crowds waving Israeli

and US flags and photos of the hostages as they watched their return; tears of joy in Gaza and the occupied West Bank as Palestinian prisoners were freed. Clearly there were many questions about what would happen next, and whether or not the Plan would lead to a lasting peace; but in that moment on Monday 13^{th} October there was a sense of joy – and a sense of an answer to the prayers of so many people. And I found it interesting that Donald Trump himself used that language of answered prayer.

By the time you read this article we'll have a clearer sense of how the Peace Plan is unfolding; and there are bound to be setbacks and challenges along the way. But my sense is that we need to continue to prayfor our world, for the Church, for the parish of All Saints. November this year is a season of festivals: All Saints' Day (2^{nd}) , Remembrance Sunday (9^{th}) , Advent Sunday (30^{th}) . These festivals encourage us to remember, but also to pray – giving thanks for all that has gone before, and looking ahead in hope for the future.

One of the things I value most about the Anglican Church is our life of prayer, and particularly the 'daily offices'. It's a pattern we inherited from the monastic tradition, and one that has sustained the life of the Church for centuries. This November I would encourage you to join in that tradition of daily prayer (9.15am on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays in the Reading Room and on Zoom; Thursdays at 9.30am for Communion; Fridays and Saturdays on our own; Sundays at 8am, 10am and 4pm). Prayer is one of the Lord's most special gifts to us: it draws us close to him, it changes us, and it brings hope to our world. Please do join me in the coming month in this most significant ministry of prayer.

Wyc iffe MISSION FOCUS: Bib e THE MOTORBIKE MINISTRY IN PAPUA NEW GUINEA

All Saints supports a focused group of charities, both local and international, as part of the way we live out and show Jesus' love in a practical and biblical way. You can read more about our charities on the 'get involved' section of the All Saints' website. This month, we look at our long-term partners, the Koens family, working with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Papua New Guinea.

The 'Jesus Video Bike', pictured below, has for many years provided a vital means of transportation through the island's remote jungle roads and has featured in past stories from the field. The motorbike (along with other vehicles such as four-wheel drive and all-terrain quadbike vehicles) enables the work of the Wycliffe Bible Translation team who use it as a mode of transport to villages, and for delivering hymnbooks, Bibles and school supplies.

As a mechanic, Andrew supports translators and other missionaries by working on motorcycles, generators and other small engines, while Clare serves in the area of missionary kid care and education.

Andrew was recently pleased to report that this bike is still going strong.



It was in the workshop recently so that Andrew could carry out vital maintenance, and is now back in use. This is a reminder that behind the 'glamorous' work linguists of the translating the Bible into tribal languages are the practical skills of



mechanics and a wide ranging team of support workers including teachers and administrators who all play an important role in getting the job done.

WHO REMEMBERS THE CHURCH ROOF FIRE?

A couple of months ago, I received a letter from Malcolm Garner. With the letter was a pristine copy of the consecration service booklet used at All Saints in 1967. Malcolm was the crucifer at that service (see picture below).



In his letter, Malcolm explained that he had been going through all his old slides. Although many were of steam trains, Malcolm also found some of All Saints. Malcolm lived at 16 Vicarage Gate and in May 1966 they had work done on their chimney. Making use of the scaffolding, Malcolm took a picture of the church with the cathedral behind it. It's a great view of the church that was there before the building that we enjoy now.



Malcom and I had an email exchange which I thought you'd all like to hear. In his own words:

"One other memory I have is of one day, when the new church was being built. The lovely shaped wooden roof (hyperbolic paraboloid) had been put on top, but not yet given its metal covering. That day I came home from somewhere and saw smoke rising from the roof. I alerted my parents and rushed up a ladder and with water from somewhere doused the small infant fire. It hadn't really caught hold and I think had just slightly charred the surface of a small area of the roof. I don't know how it was started, possibly spontaneous combustion? As far as I know this was simply covered over by the metal skin and therefore today looks no different.

I often wondered, if the roof covering were to be removed, would any mysterious superficial charring still be evident? I wonder if anyone else has any recollection of that incident, or even if it was hushed up a bit?!"

And in a subsequent email:

"After sending that message and photo I thought I'd check my diary for about summer 1967 which I thought was probably when the roof fire occurred. (I used to keep a detailed diary then - a habit long since abandoned!). To my surprise I found it quickly - Wednesday 12th July 1967. The diary entry reads:

'At 1600hrs I noticed the church roof was on fire. Me and another chap managed to put it out before the Fire Brigade arrived - Exciting.'

So there you have it - chapter and verse!"

Malcolm went on to say: "I mentioned the church roof fire to my brothers and sister. The brothers had never heard of it but my sister remembered it well because Mum made all the firemen a cuppa and they piled in the kitchen to drink it with the fire engine outside. Pretty memorable for an 11 year old girl!"

What a great account of the early life of our beloved building!

BIG BUILD UPDATE



After a search for a new architect, we have now whittled down the task to just two. The first is the practice which carries out our quinquennial and knows the church well – Nye Saunders based in Godalming. The second is led by our own Bijou Harding in cooperation with a practice called Symbiosis Architects Ltd who are based in East Sussex. Bijou has been a member of the Big Build team since the

start and has helped us understand the journey we are on from an architect's point of view.

Whichever practice is chosen will take on the next stage of the design work. This will include the development of the construction drawings and liaison with a range of specialist engineers. It is hoped that the team will make a decision in early November.

We had heard nothing from Guildford Borough Council by the 30th September so we made several attempts to contact them by phone and email in early October. It was not until the 8th that we heard and there is another extension to the 28th October deadline, as they consider our Climate Change questionnaire. The initial cause of delay, The Surrey Wildlife Trust, sent their report to GBC on 16th October and this has been added to the planning portal.

The process of selling 6 Thorn Bank is now underway and a firm offer has been received by Chantries & Pewleys after two sessions of accompanied visits. Statutory two months' notice has been served on the current tenants starting from 22^{nd} October.





Single occupancy almshouse available in Guildford

Situated in a Grade II listed building in Bury Street, this cottage is a short walk from Guildford town centre and the main line station. It is part-furnished and comprises a living room, kitchen and bathroom on the ground floor, and one bedroom on the first floor. A modest but delightful garden surrounds the almshouses and residents share responsibility for maintaining the garden with the help and guidance of a gardener. Residents benefit from this communal outdoor space, which has helped develop a sense of community. It is hoped that applicants would welcome being part of this.

To be a beneficiary of Caleb Lovejoy's Almshouse Charity, applicants must:

- be in financial need.
- be capable of independent living.
- have lived in the Borough of Guildford for at least two years. If the trustees are unable to find applicants who meet all these criteria, they may consider those who have resided in Guildford for less than two years, or who have strong local connections to Guildford through family or employment.





Haydn: The Creation

The creation of light, the heavens and earth


