## **ALL SAINTS SERVICES AND OPENING TIMES**

Our pattern of services is as follows:

- ★ Morning Prayer takes place Monday to Wednesday at 9.15am in the church and via Zoom for anyone who would like this option.
- ★ A service of Holy Communion is held in church every Thursday morning at 9.30am.
- ★ An 8am service of Holy Communion is held in church on the first and third Sundays of the month (the third Sunday will use the Book of Common Prayer).
- ★ Our 10am Sunday services follow this pattern:
  - First Sunday: Café-style Altogether Worship
  - Second, fourth and fifth Sundays:
     Family Communion with Children's Church
  - Third Sunday: Morning Worship with Children's Church Note: Children's Church is term-time only
- ★ Each Sunday, we hold 'Tea-Time Church' at 4pm.

#### THOUGHTS FROM THE VICARAGE - NEW BEGINNINGS



I find it interesting that the penultimate chapter of the Bible, Revelation chapter 21, speaks of new things to come. You might expect the final chapters of the Bible to speak about endings and final things but not so; The Lord says, 'Behold, I am making all things new!' (Revelation 21:5).

The context is a vision that was given to the apostle John, during his exile on the island of Patmos. It was around the year 95 AD, when Christians were

entering a time of persecution. John writes to encourage the early Christians to stand firm, knowing that at a time in the future the Lord would 'make all things new'. He was looking ahead to a time when God would 'wipe away every tear from their eyes' (21:4); a time when there will be 'no more death or mourning or crying or pain' (21:4); a time when the old order of things has passed away.

It's a reminder to us that the Lord is always 'making things new'. He creates, and he re-creates. He gives life, and he also gives new life. Old things pass away, and new things take their place.

We're often aware of that during the month of September – a time of new beginnings in a variety of ways. New school terms begin. Young people come to The University of Surrey for the first time, to begin their studies. Graduates often start new jobs at this time of year. And church life often follows that same pattern: Children's Church starts again, as families return from summer holidays; we gather together for our Church Family Picnic (8th), to catch up with each other after a time apart; we celebrate 'Back Pack Sunday' (8th) when we encourage children and adults to bring their school bag or work bag, praying for each other as we begin the new term. And I'm delighted that we're starting September with a baptism (1st), celebrating the beginning of the Christian journey for my little grandson Joel.

September marks the beginning of a new season. It's a reminder that the Lord is able to make 'all things new'. It's a message of hope for us, and for our world.

#### MISSION FOCUS: FRIENDS INTERNATIONAL GUILDFORD




Friends International Guildford (FIG) is a local Christian charity, which aims to support international students. It comes under the umbrella of Friends International Ministries, based at All Nations Christian College in Ware, Herts.

In the last academic year there were just over 5,000 international students registered with The

University of Surrey, the majority of whom are on post-graduate courses and research. Working for Friends International in Guildford are two staff members, Lilli and Phil. They are now part of the University Chaplaincy team which has been a wonderful development and given FIG a valued role within the university as well as a higher profile. The financial support for Lilli and Phil, and for all the work of FIG, comes through the generosity of local churches and supporters. All Saints is pleased to be able to contribute a little as part of our mission giving.



Life can be very different moving to a new country and studying abroad.



Friends International understands that these students are facing new challenges, new languages and a different culture. Finding their place in this new area called Surrey takes time, and the staff and volunteers in FIG are there to help. They organise events, experiences and social meet ups (online and in-person). These activities help students in building friendships with other students, make local links with families and explore life in the UK. They also have opportunities to learn about, and take part in, British culture to

get the most out of their time whilst at university here in Guildford.

All Saints has been able to host 'Rendezvous' for several years. It has met one Friday evening a month, at first in the Vicarage, and then as numbers got too many, in the Reading Room. Rendezvous was



set up with a number of female FIG volunteers for female international students who really appreciate spending time together, building friendships and learning and sharing together. The church has also been able to host occasional events for students and volunteers – a summer BBQ in the field, a tea in the hall, a service of praise and thanksgiving for the work in FIG in the church, etc.

The students really appreciate the friendship and support that they receive. Look at <a href="www.friendsinternationalguildford.org.uk/exhibit/">www.friendsinternationalguildford.org.uk/exhibit/</a> for some lovely stories from former students telling how their contact with



staff and volunteers made such a difference to their stay here. And the students aren't the only ones! The volunteers benefit too. Peter and I have been volunteers with Friends International for many years and we have learnt so much from the students. We have learnt about other cultures and belief

systems, and discussed with them our own. Our world view has become so much wider and richer. We have shared our British food and enjoyed tasting theirs. We have been privileged to have formed some deep and lasting friendships with a few of the students, and also found friendship and support amongst the volunteers from many churches across Guildford. I am sure all the volunteers would say the same.

Please look on the FIG website for ways to be involved – giving financially, supporting the work in prayer, giving time to support events, offering to invite a couple of students to your home for a meal. Do talk with Peter and me, the Whitemans, or the Hopwoods if you want to know a bit more. We have all been involved in one way or another over a number of years.

### FINANCE IS (STILL) FUNI

I'm pleased to say that our church finances this year are going to plan, so far.

Your generosity has meant we are seeing an increase in donations over last year, which is key to us being able to develop our mission in the community - so thank you so much and please continue to give. It is really changing what we can do.

This month we have been able to fund fencing and gates to make our field area safe and also find funds for some urgent tree work we need to do.



We are blessed with a growing intergenerational church and this means expanding our

youth and pastoral care mission. We have been able to fund bringing new people into the pastoral team and the training they need and to also pay for a salaried person to lead our toddlers group as a youth leader. We have a job advert out for this right now. The youth team are replacing and adding new games that we're also very able to fund too.

This all takes a bit of planning and our finance team (Trish, Eve, Beverly and me) meet regularly to keep it running smoothly and to look for ways of funding the unexpected and make reliable projections of our finances to support God's mission in the parish.

We'd like to mention Gift Aid. It hugely helps our income in the year. We estimate we will receive £13,000 this year - just under 10% of our annual income. Every time we receive donations from a UK tax payer, we also receive 25% more of the donation as Gift Aid, so it's really import to us and for our mission. So may I encourage you to just check that when you generously give to All Saints for God's mission here, that you ensure it is Gift Aided!

Additionally, if you are one of the wonderful people who buy things for the church and do not claim expenses - and you pay tax - might we encourage you to claim the expense which we will reimburse you. You can then still continue to pay for the items but by a donation back to us. We'll then receive 25% more through your generosity. Please just ask one of the finance team if you need some more explanation or if we can help

#### ALL SAINTS' BIG BUILD UPDATE

The new floor plan and displays of the elevation have been a talking point for some of our congregation. Comments have ranged from the flower cupboard being too small to "can I push a buggy safely from the

church to the hall?" Happily, by showing the questioners the actual areas involved, which admittedly are hard to visualise on the floor plan, and the new ramps which will be constructed, these fears have been allayed.

The plans, a statement of need, the Community Audit, photographs of the effect of subsidence and the architect's statement, have been submitted to the Diocesan Advisory Committee for initial approval when it next meets in early October. This will lead to a submission to the Planning Department of Guildford Borough Council for pre planning approval. At this stage minor changes might be made before we seek full planning approval.

After diocesan approval, the architects will develop much more detailed drawings which will also involve the structural aspects of the project. This will then enable us to get a more accurate costing of the work.

The second phase of the project is now up and running and the Finance Vision Group is working on a strategy for raising the funds needed. In the interim, further events are being organised which will raise funds to help pay for the professional fees being incurred.

The picture that follows is the south elevation of the church (looking from Vicarage Gate) with the proposed developments.



#### KEY:

- A Library and chapel demolished due to the subsidence
- B New church access door/fire escape
- C Larger, lighter entrance hall with better facilities
- New kitchen, new church office, three new toilets (one accessible)
- Ramp from entrance down to the church hall for safe access

## ACTS - SPONSORED BIBLE READING IN AID OF THE KOENS. SATURDAY 17TH AUGUST 2024

This was a gripping read – so often in private study one only reads a few verses from a book of the Bible at a time, and on this Saturday a group of us read all 28 chapters of the book of Acts over the period of three hours (with two tea breaks). We were joined during the morning by other people who were welcome to come for a shorter time.

The book of Acts relates a time of upheaval in the early church. As the introduction to Acts in the Youth Bible relates: It looked like everything was over. Jesus was dead – executed by the Romans. After three years with Jesus, the disciples weren't sure what to do next. But three days later Jesus rose from the dead and the world has never been the same.

Written by Luke, Acts picks up where the Gospel of Luke ends. It tells how Jesus went up into heaven, then sent his Holy Spirit fifty days later (Acts 2). The rest of the book tells how the Good News of Jesus Christ spread rapidly throughout the world. Most of the book focuses on two people: Peter and Paul, and Paul's travels to spread the Good News.

Acts tells about a time Christians were in danger. Many churches had to meet in hiding, yet the early Christians didn't back down. Their determination can encourage us to live out our faith and tell others about it – even when we are tempted to hide it.



Those who took part have expressed the wish to do another bible reading as a group, maybe next year. It was good having the tea breaks where we could walk around, and also talk about what we had read, and we felt moved by the experience. We raised £195 plus Gift Aid (current total) but the sponsorship was not the main point of the morning – anyone was welcome even if they

had not sponsored a passage. The main focus of the morning was to learn more about the early church, the trials they faced and be encouraged in our own faith.



### ONE YEAR IN!

I've just completed my first year in ordination training. Forty lectures, three away weekends and ten assignments in 22,923 words, covering mission in our parish, academic bible study, Christian ethics, Christian discipleship, preaching, worship and theological reflection.

The course is a three year course leading to ordination in June 2026, after which I will continue to serve at All Saints and also as a priest resource to the Diocese.

I am part of the Local Ministry Programme within the Guildford Diocese that is a theological college with other similar dioceses. It follows a mission and theology degree programme within the framework of Durham University. I intend to go on after ordination to finish the degree which is a further two years of part time study.

The course is part time and we have lectures every Monday evening from September to July, with term breaks similar to schools. We have work to do prior to the lectures the week before which needs about twenty hours a week study time. I've read forty theological books this year! We have two assignments set for each module which are marked and go forward to Durham University.

Our sermons and service leading are also assessed. I am so fortunate to have Beverly to support my studies and we meet every month to catch up. I also have a support group to help me from within the parish and I do need to make more regular meetings this next term as my colleagues remind me!

This year we have covered:

- Christian initiation in baptism and confirmation, including the theology and history within the church
- The theology of spirituality and discipleship
- Liturgy from the Eucharist and Service of the Word services
- Reflective theology and vocational mission
- A study into the demographics of this parish and the congregation
- Academic review of the Old and New Testaments
- Exegesis (study) and hermeneutics (interpretation) of scripture for sermon and bible study

- Assessment of the old covenants and the new covenant
- Ethics including both secular (universal and subversive) and ecclesial

I've loved every module and can see God forming me in my path to ordination. I think my favourite module is ethics. I'd never studied it before but it is fascinating to study different view points, how they try to include everyone and how, by this, they exclude others, and then how the church seeks to bring them together with God at the centre and the conflict this can create, for which, as a priest, you are called to find resolution.

The course itself is all about formation and the journey the ordinand is on towards ordination. I look upon my role in church very differently now, with each and every one of you I am called to love, walk with and serve.

#### GREETINGS FROM UKARUMPA PAPUA NEW GUINEAI

This month we are celebrating the publication of the Enga New Testament. We are also introducing the trauma healing work that our organisation will be supporting in Enga Province, to help those affected by the May landslide.

The Enga language has more speakers than any other vernacular PNG language.





Enga speakers can now hear and read the New Testament in their own language, as well as accessing materials on the <a href="Enga Bible Website">Enga Bible Website</a>.

To see more of the celebrations and hear from the Engan Translators, watch the dedication video on <u>YouTube</u> or <u>Facebook</u>.

Our neighbour, Adam Boyd, is a translation advisor for the Enga language. The Boyds' website has a lot more information about their work, and also mentions the landslide that happened at the end of May in Enga province.

A <u>trauma healing workshop</u> is planned in September; Engan speakers will be trained to bring messages of hope and healing to those affected by the landslide. The costs of travel and accommodation for trainees and trainers quickly add up; financial contributions would gladly be received by the <u>Enga Bible translation project</u>.

Please pray and praise God with us:

- We rejoice that the Engan people are able to hear and read God's word in their own language. Please pray for changed hearts and lives.
- Please pray that those receiving training at the Enga trauma healing workshop would know God's healing in their own lives. Pray for them too as they share the material with those affected by the landslide.
- Please pray for Clare as she juggles several roles within the Staff Care department (one of her colleagues is at a long training course for those new to the country).

- Clare would appreciate prayer for the online parenting workshop that she is offering to Wycliffe staff around the world on 3rd and 4th September.
- We praise God that the Autoshop has a manager again!
- Thanks for praying for our work trip to Lae. Our trip was safe and successful, and we were also able to purchase a working oven for our own house, something we've been without for a long time!


#### NORTH GUILDFORD FOOD BANK - 2024 SO FAR

Total number of parcels distributed in 2024	1031
Total number of people fed	2670
Adults	1606

There are nearly 200 agencies that refer clients to the food bank for our support. Guildford Borough Council are our top referring agency this year so far having submitted 326 referrals.

The main causes for referral are (in order of most to least common) are cost of living, low income, benefit delay, unemployment, sickness, benefit cut and debt.

Top Referring Agencies of 2024


