THE DECLARATIONS

The candidates to be admitted and licensed as Licensed Lay Ministers (Readers) have already made the following declarations in the presence of the Bishop.

The Preface – The Bishop

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

The Declarations – The Candidates

I, AB, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

I, AB, will give due obedience to the Bishop of Guildford and his successors in all things lawful and honest.

I, AB, about to be licensed or given permission to officiate to exercise the office of Licensed Lay Minister in the Diocese of Guildford, do hereby promise to endeavour, as far as in me lies, to promote peace and unity, and to conduct myself as becomes a worker for Christ, for the good of his Church, and for the spiritual welfare of all people. I will give due obedience to the minister in whose cure I may serve, in all things lawful and honest.

Sermon

The Bishop of Dorking

ADMISSION AND LICENSING

The candidates for admission come and stand before the Bishop with their Parish Priests standing at their seats.

Bishop My brothers and sisters, God has called us into the fellowship of the universal Church. As members together of his body, Christ calls us to minister in his name and, according to our gifts, to be instruments of his love in the world. Licensed Lay Ministers (Readers) are called to serve the Church of God and to work together with clergy and other ministers. They are to lead public worship, to preach and teach the word of God, to assist at the Eucharist and to share in pastoral and evangelistic work. As authorised lay ministers, they are to encourage the ministries of God's people, as the Spirit distributes gifts among us all. They are called to help the whole Church to participate in God's mission to the world. Canon Dr Steve Summers, Principal of the Local Ministry Programme, Guildford presents the candidates.

PrincipalBishop, I present to you Peter Evans, Heather Goddard,
Alison Moulden, David Shervington and Iain Whitlam to
be admitted to the office of Licensed Lay Minister.

They have affirmed and declared their belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness. They have also made the declaration of obedience to the Bishop and the declaration which must be made before a Licensed Lay Minister is licensed.

- *Bishop* Are they persons of Christian character, well versed in the Holy Scriptures and in the doctrines of our faith?
- *Principal* They are.
- *Bishop* Have they been sufficiently prepared for the duties of this office?
- *Principal* They have.

The Questions

The Bishop addresses the candidates.

Bishop In order that we may be satisfied that you are ready to begin the ministry of a Licensed Lay Minister, you must now answer the questions we put to you.
 Do you believe God is calling you to this ministry?

Candidates I do so believe.

- *Bishop* Will you be faithful in leading the people of God in worship, and in preaching the word to them?
- *Candidates* By the grace of God, I will.
- *Bishop* Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith, and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the Gospel?
- Candidates By the grace of God, I will.
- *Bishop* Will you endeavour to fashion your life according to the way of Christ?
- *Candidates* By the grace of God, I will.
- *Bishop* Will you promote unity, peace and love in the Church and in the world, and especially among those whom you serve?
- *Candidates* By the grace of God, I will.

The candidates turn and face the congregation, whom the Bishop then addresses:

- Bishop Brothers and sisters, Peter, Heather, Alison, David and Iain have been chosen for the office of Licensed Lay Minister. Will you uphold and encourage them in their ministry?All We will.
- BishopWill you continue to pray for them?AllWe will.

The Admission

The Candidates turn back to face the Bishop. The Warden of LLMs introduces each candidate and the Bishop then admits them by delivery of a Bible and their scarf, and with these words:

Bishop N, I admit you as a Licensed Lay Minister in the Church, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Bishop blesses the candidates.

- Bishop May the Lord give you wisdom, courage, strength and love to do his will, and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, rest upon you, and on your work done in his name, now and always.
- All Amen.

The newly admitted LLMs turn to face the congregation before returning to their seats, and their Parish Priests sit down.

The Licensing

The newly admitted LLMs and the LLMs whose Licences are to be renewed stand. The Warden presents all these LLMs to the Bishop.

Warden Bishop, I present these ministers (standing here) to be licensed or re-licensed for ministry in this diocese as Licensed Lay Ministers.

The Bishop addresses these LLMs

- *Bishop* You are called to serve principally in a particular benefice. Will you work willingly and collaboratively with the clergy and other colleagues in ministry there, and give due obedience to those who are set in authority over you?
- *LLMs* We will.

The parish clergy for the LLMs about to be licensed or re-licensed stand alongside their LLMs, and the Bishop addresses them:

- Bishop My brothers and sisters, will you as Parish Priests welcome and work closely with these Licensed Lay Ministers as your colleagues, and encourage them to use their gifts and develop their ministry?
- *Clergy* We will.
- *Bishop* Will you commend them to the people amongst whom they will minister?
- *Clergy* We will.

Clergy sit.

The Warden reads the name and benefice of each LLM to be licensed or re-licensed, as each LLM comes forward. The Bishop gives the LLM their licence and he or she returns to their seat (remaining standing). After they have all received their licences, the Bishop addresses these LLMs:

- *Bishop* Receive authority to exercise the office of Licensed Lay Ministers in this diocese.
- LLMs Amen.
- *Bishop* May the Lord be with you in all your work and ministry from this day onwards.

The Welcome

When the LLMs have been licensed they turn to look around the congregation. All present stand to welcome them.

Warden We welcome you as ministers of God's word.

All May the word of Christ dwell in you richly.

The Bishop invites the congregation to applaud.

The congregation sit down, except for **all** the LLMs present, who remain standing for a prayer of commitment together:

LLMs God our Father, we offer our lives to do your work in your Church and in the world. Help us by your Holy Spirit to hear more clearly your call to deeper commitment in your service, and give us grace to respond with gladness: for the glory of Christ our Lord. Amen.
